Dear Mr. Levy,

My name is Chris Triolo and I represent 1500+ members of a growing grassroots organization who have raised several issues concerning the Matinecock Court Housing Project in East Northport. We have voiced concerns with our Town of Huntington representatives who have openly stated that they will not consider their community's concerns due to the threat of litigation. In as much as the process is currently in the control of the County of Suffolk with regards to the Sewage Treatment Plant, we have communicated our concerns to Legislator Jon Cooper. In addition to representing the area where this project is to be located, we understand he also sits on the Board responsible for the approval of this Sewage Treatment Plant.

The plant, we contend, is being built in such a manner as to put the residents of this community at risk through the use of hazardous materials undisclosed, either in error or by deception by Housing Help Inc. (HHI), and the discharge of 37,500 gallons per day of effluent into the ground, which is 1200 feet from a Suffolk County wellfield, and is atop of the Long Island Sole Source Aquifer. This plant will also be in very close proximity to two schools with thousands of children and staff, and will be surrounded by thousands of people in our community as well as the Long Island Railroad and a LIPA Substation.

We have attached our last email to Legislator Jon Cooper dated June 25th and the data that is derived directly from HHI's submission of their Environmental Impact Statement. It is this very data that we believe makes this STP fatally flawed, coupled with an equally suspect hydrology study and an ambiguous soil remediation study. Its lack of current data, flawed information, and omissions are cause enough, in our opinion, for serious oversight and ultimately the denial of forward process.

We believe that this plan and the issues we have brought forward risk the lives, the health and the safety of our children, our community and ironically, the potential residents of this project that HHI wants built at any cost, no matter who it may hurt in the future, long after HHI is gone.

We would hope that you will review this material carefully, and we ask that you consider the

health, safety and welfare of your constituency as a whole and not only of a special interest who is adept at filing lawsuits.

It is our intention to continue to inform the public with the very information HHI has used to shoehorn this project forward. We intend to grow as an organization and build alliances with any individual, group or organization with common goals to protect our community from the environmental harm HHI seeks to effect upon us. We welcome open lines of communication from you as our representatives, but we do not wish to hear anymore rhetoric. We want our concerns investigated, we want these issues addressed and we want accountability. We intend to hold our elected officials accountable. It is our sincere hope we can count on you and your office as an ally in this matter.

Time is of the essence as no one seems to be terribly quick to respond, but the process is rumbling on. It is because of that that we expect a response from your office in the very near future. We look forward to hearing from you.
